

Dear Mr. McCann,

As per our recent phone conversation, I wish to have permission to transport a diagnostic dose of 10-20 uCi. of I-131 from St. Joseph Mercy Hospital to the Evangelical Nursing Home to administer to an 82 year old white female with hyperthyroidism and previously decompensated heart failure. I would personally transport and administer the diagnostic dose to the patient in her room at the nursing home. The following day she will be brought by ambulance to St. Joseph Mercy Hospital at which time the 24 hour radioactive iodine counting procedure would be performed. If the radioactive iodine uptake is sufficiently high enough to allow outpatient therapy, she will be treated with 29.9 mCi. of I-131 and returned to the Evangelical Nursing Home by ambulance. If it is not felt that she can be adequately treated as an outpatient, she will be hospitalized and treated as an inpatient.
