Dear Mr. Grimsley:

This is a non-commercial request under the Freedom of Information and Privacy acts.

As stated in section (4) (A) of the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. 522, as amended in 1974 by public law 93-52, the information requested by Grand Rapids Magazine is "primarily benefiting the general public," so I request a waiver of any fees.

I request a complete and thorough search of all filing systems and locations for all records maintained by your agency pertaining to the enclosed document, which is an internal hand-written N.R.C. letter (ACN# 8804130141) that has been previously released under a FOIA request (as is indicated at the bottom left-hand corner of the front page).

This is a request for all records that are related to all matters discussed in the letter, including, but not limited to: the conclusions of the investigation; any penalties or discipline against employees of Big Rock Point nuclear plant or Consumers Power consequent of the investigation or of the events which prompted the investigation; transcriptions of interviews of people (NRC staff, Consumers Power employees or contract employees) for the NRC investigation.

This request specifically includes, but is not limited to, numbered and lettered subfiles, memos, investigation reports, licensee event reports, copies of photographs, search slips, abstracts, tapes or handwritten typed logs, transcriptions of telephone conversations and any other kinds of documents.

I wish to make it clear that I want all records in your office "identifiable with" this request, even though reports on those records or copies of the records remain in another office, such as Region III in Chicago. I do not want "interim" documents only. I want all documents as they appear in all files, in all forms in all units of your agency.

If documents are denied in part, please specify the exemptions claimed for each page or passage. For documents withheld in their entirety, please state, in addition, the date of and the number of pages in each document. If any records responsive to this request are stamped or in any way identified as classified (or as "safeguards information"), please treat this as a request that such records be declassified.


I request that excised material be "blackened out" rather than "whited out" or "cut out" and that the remaining non-exempt portions of documents be released as provided for under the Freedom of Information Act.

Please advise of any destruction of records and include the date of and authority for such destruction.

Please call rather than write if you have any questions concerning this request.

I expect a response to this request within ten (10) working days, as provided for in the Freedom of Information Act.

At approximately 11:55 A.M. 4/13/87, the
undersigned received the following
information from John Davidson, NRC.

Region III was telephonically contacted by
an individual (name unknown) who stated
that he had been fired from Big Rock
Point 1 on 2/20/87, for sabotage/tampering
with a safety related valve. The individual
stated that at a hearing on 3/18/87, the
licensee furnished him with a paper which
explained their reasons for his termination.
The individual denies having tampered with
any safety equipment and alleges that the
person who tampered with the valve is
still employed at the site.

Contact was made with Jim Creed, Region ~~III~~ ^{IV}, who stated that in his discussions with the licensee, 4/10/87, he had been informed that a safety related valve had been tampered with on 2/7/87, and that the individual had been fired for the action. The valve in question would not have functioned as designed in the tampered condition. However, repairs were made and the valve is now operable.

Region ~~III~~ ^{IV} personnel are in the process of collecting additional information and have the following actions under consideration: 1) talk to individual who made allegation, 2) visit the site and 3) contact the FBI for the purpose of criminal investigation.

Regional OI personnel are also involved.
