This is in reply to your letter of January 11th, our license application enclosed.

I would like to ask you to expedite this application special handling as there is some urgency in our being permitted to start our new contract with the Virginia Dept. of Health, Inc. It has been awarded a three year contract to provide the radioactive contaminated clothing for the North Atlantic Navy Shipyard, the contract period having started January 15th.
