NOTICE OF RENEWAL OF FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE
UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA
DOCKET NO. 50-396

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued Amendment No. 4 to Facility Operating License No. R-123 for the University of Virginia (the licensee) which renews the license for operation of the CAVALIER training reactor located in Charlottesville, Virginia. The facility is a non-power reactor that has been operating at power levels not in excess of 100 watts (thermal). The renewed Operating License No. R-123 will expire twenty years from the date of issuance.

The amended license complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I. Those findings are set forth in the license amendment. Opportunity for hearing was afforded in the notice of the proposed issuance of this renewal in the Federal Register on August 2, 1984 at 49 FR 31017. No request for a hearing or petition for leave to intervene was filed following notice of the proposed action.

The Commission has prepared a Safety Evaluation Report (NUREG-1119) for the renewal of Facility Operating License No. R-123 and has, based on that report, concluded that the facility can continue to be operated by the licensee without endangering the health and safety of the public.

The Commission also has prepared an Environmental Assessment, dated May 1, 1985, for the renewal of Facility Operating License No. R-123 and has concluded that this action will not have a significant effect on the quality of the human environment. The Notice of Finding of No Significant Environmental Impact was published in the Federal Register on May 16, 1985 at 50 FR 20512.
