Enclosed you will find my application for a material license regarding the Lixiscope that I currently hold. I have attached my current New York City license. I maintain this unit at 631 Park Avenue; New York, N.Y. 10021. I have satisfied the necessary prerequisites including educational hours, as well as approved standards for the use of Lixiscope.

However, I am currently opening an office in Fort Lee, New Jersey under a new division of Ambulatory Foot Care Associates. I would like to be able to bring my Lixiscope from New York City to New Jersey which is about 15 minutes driving time. This will always be transported by me personally in the trunk of my car. I do not feel that I wish to go through the expense of maintaining two separate Lixiscopes and therefore would like to be able to travel between New York and New Jersey.

Therefore:

1. I have pended the \$580.00 application fee since I already maintain a New York City license. Do I have to pay the \$580.00 fee? Please advise and a check will be forthcoming.
2. Am I allowed to bring the Lixiscope from New York City to New Jersey (Fort Lee)?
3. Is there reciprocity by virtue of my New York City license in order to bring it to New Jersey and will I be within conformity of City and Federal guidelines.
