NOTICE OF VIOLATION

As a result of the inspection conducted on March 13, 1985, and in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy (10 CFR 2, Appendix C), the following violations were identified:

- A. 10 CFR 20.203(f) requires that each container of licensed material bear a durable, clearly visible label identifying the radioactive contents.

Contrary to the above, as of March 13, 1985, the individual gauges did not bear a clearly visible label identifying the radioactive contents.

These are Severity Level IV violation. (Supplement IV)

- B. Condition 17 of License No. 07-14100-03 requires that licensed material be possessed and used in accordance with statements, representations and procedures contained in application dated January 19, 1984.

Block 10 of this application requires that a Eberline Model E-130 survey meter be available for measuring radioactive contamination and radiation levels.

Contrary to the above, on March 13, 1985, the required survey meter was not available, nor was an equivalent low-level survey meter available.

This is a Severity Level IV violation. (Supplement VI)

- C. 10 CFR 19.11(a) and (b) require that current copies of Part 19, Part 20, the license, license conditions, documents incorporated into the license, license amendments and operating procedures be posted, or that a notice describing these documents and where they may be examined, be posted. 10 CFR 19.11(c) requires that Form NRC-3, "Notice to Employees", be posted.

Contrary to the above, on March 13, 1985, neither the documents nor the notices were posted.

This is a Severity Level V violation. (Supplement VI)

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Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, General Foods Manufacturing Corporation is hereby required to submit to this office within thirty days of the date of the letter which transmitted this Notice, a written statement or explanation in reply, including: (1) the corrective steps which have been taken and the results achieved; (2) corrective steps which will be taken to avoid further violations; and (3) the date when full compliance will be achieved. Where good cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending this response time.
