FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST


On June 2, EDO James M. Taylor presented to the commissioners a list of 13 licensees who have submitted requests for license amendments and new licenses to store Low-Level Radioactive Waste (LLRW) over the past year. A copy of the list of licensees, their license numbers, and the covering title page (SECY-92-202) is appended here.

I have been unable to find any of these requests in the NRC's Public Document Room, and though the PDR staff was able to trace some amendment activity in earlier years, a staff search has also failed to turn up any copies of the past year's requests.

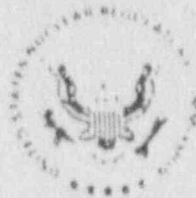
Therefore, in accordance with 5 U. S. C. 552(a)(4)(iii) governing FOIA requests and fee waivers, I am requesting copies of all of the past year's requests by materials licensees for license amendments and new licenses to store LLRW, including but not limited to those in the SECY document. It is my expectation that this request can be filled within the two-hour search limit and the 100-page copying limit, and therefore I assume fee waiver.

Purpose: To provide the Commission with the first
annual report identifying the number of
requests that the Nuclear Regulatory
Commission has received for license
amendments and licenses to store low-level
radioactive waste (LLW), and the number of
amendments or licenses granted. The report
fulfills the Commission direction in the
January 30, 1992, Staff Requirements
Memorandum (SRM), and provides a summary of
LLW storage licensing requests, and
authorizations granted, through March 1992.

Background: In the January 30, 1992, SRM, the Commission
directed the staff to undertake a rulemaking
to establish a regulatory framework setting
forth the procedures and criteria that will
apply to on-site storage of LLW beyond
January 1, 1996. The Commission also

LLW storage is permitted at all reactors under their Part 50 licenses. Reactor licensees requiring additional storage of LLW often manage these changes through the 10 CFR 50.10 evaluation process. Part 50 licensees may also request a Part 50 license to store LLW. NRR has no pending requests from Part 50 licensees to store LLW on-site nor pending requests for amendments to Part 50 licenses that directly affect the storage of LLW on-site.
