SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION REPORT NO. 52-03569-02/92-01

Thank you for your response of December 30, 1992, to our Notice of Violation issued on November 17, 1992, concerning activities conducted under NRC License No. 52-03569-02. We have evaluated your response and found that it meets the requirements of 10 CFR 2.201. As requested in your January 7, 1993 letter, we will proceed with the termination of your license. Issues regarding license termination will be handled under separate correspondence.

Regarding your request for clarification, (1) although the material was not used, you were in violation of 10 CR 30.3 because you possessed the material without a valid license; (2) we did not give you credit for leak tests, other than the ones performed on November 29, 1990 and October 16, 1992, because the tests were inadequate to determine presence of contamination; (3) it was our understanding that an individual at the Health Department had performed the leak test analysis; based on your statement, Violation C is withdrawn; (4) the procedures incorporated into your license required that the capsules be locked within their lead container when not in use and during the inspection on October 21, 1992, they were not locked within their lead container inside the storage area.

We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.
