Dear Judge Hoyt:

This letter is to alert you that there were numerous typographical and other mistakes in the transcript of the interview that you, Mr. Aloit and Ms. Miller conducted with me on June 8, 1983. The errors are too numerous to list, but I would appreciate the opportunity to make corrections on the transcript, a procedure sometimes followed for transcripts of congressional hearings.

Certain errors changed the meaning of the sentences transcribed. Those corrections are listed below:

Page 8, line 1:

"OIA" should read "OI."

Page 14, line 13:

"(F)low" should read "full."

Page 19, after line 4 begins TAPE TWO SIDE ONE. Page 55 after line 8 begins TAPE ONE SIDE TWO. The order should be reversed. Additionally, the text does not appear to flow directly from TAPE ONE SIDE TWO to TAPE TWO SIDE ONE, even if they were in the proper order.

Page 39, line 12:

"One" should read "Long."

Page 41, line 2:

"(S)erved" should read "survived."

Page 41, line 14:

"(C)ommit" should read "comment."

Page 89, line 9:

"(D)enyng" should read "benign."

Page 89, line 10:

"(C)ontract" should read "contractor."

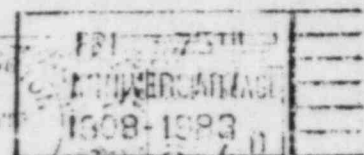
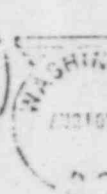
