Dear Secretary,

I am writing to express concern and objection to proposed new rules (Federal Register 47802-47821, October 20, 1992) for siting atomic reactors in more densely populated areas. I object to any reduction in the exclusion zone for smaller reactors. Further, if existing reactors cannot meet new safety standards, they should not be operated. New reactors should never be built on existing sites that already do not meet regulations.

Population density rules for reactor siting should be strengthened, not weakened. Plants which break the population density rules should be shut down.

I support tough minimum standoff distances for reactors from major human-made and natural hazards.

States should have the right to deny sites for nuclear plants.

Until the nuclear industry is shut down, reactors must be run under the most stringent regulations.
