They include (a) Commission Meeting Papers; (b) Affirmation Papers; (c) Notation Vote Papers; (d) Negative Consent Papers; and (e) Information Papers. The predecisional and/or privileged information nature of these documents frequently exempts them from disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).


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Many of these documents are not available to the public and should not be. We would appreciate it, therefore, if the complete title list were restricted to use only by the members and staff of the Subcommittee.
