SUBJECT: REQUIRED ACTIONS BASED ON GENERIC IMPLICATIONS OF SALEM ATWS  
EVENTS (GENERIC LETTER 83-28) - RESOLUTION OF ITEM 1.2, POST TRIP  
REVIEW - DATA AND INFORMATION CAPABILITY

On July 8, 1983, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) issued Generic Letter 83-28. This letter described intermediate-term actions to be taken by licensees as a result of the Salem anticipated transient without scram events. For Item 1.2 of the Generic Letter, licensees were to describe current or planned capability to record, recall and display data and information to be used in diagnosing the causes of unscheduled reactor shutdowns and for ascertaining the proper functioning of safety-related equipment.

By letter dated November 8, 1983, the Connecticut Yankee Atomic Power Company responded to Item 1.2 of GL 83-28. The response was discussed and clarified in conference calls made on June 5, 10 and 11 of this year. Based upon our review, the staff concludes that the licensee's post-trip review data and information capabilities for the Haddam Neck Plant are acceptable. A copy of our safety evaluation is enclosed.
