

MATERIALS LICENSE

Amendment No. 01

Pursuant to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, the Energy Reorganization Act of 1974 (Public Law 93-438), and Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter I, Parts 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 40 and 70, and in reliance on statements and representations heretofore made by the licensee, a license is hereby issued authorizing the licensee to receive, acquire, possess, and transfer byproduct, source, and special nuclear material designated below; to use such material for the purpose(s) and at the place(s) designated below; to deliver or transfer such material to persons authorized to receive it in accordance with the regulations of the applicable Part(s). This license shall be deemed to contain the conditions specified in Section 183 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, and is subject to all applicable rules, regulations and orders of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission now or hereafter in effect and to any conditions specified below.

10. Licensed material shall be used only at the licensee's facilities located at
Genesee County Interceptor and Treatment Facilities, Waste Water Treatment Plant,
9290 Farrand Road, Montrose, Michigan.
11. The licensee shall comply with the provisions of Title 10, Chapter 1, Code of Federal
Regulations, Part 19, "Notices, Instructions and Reports to Workers; Inspections" and
Part 20, "Standards for Protection Against Radiation."
12. Licensed material shall be used by, or under the supervision of, Sigitas Viskantas.

13. A. (1) Each sealed source shall be tested for leakage and/or contamination at intervals not to exceed three years. In the absence of a certificate from a transferor indicating that a test has been made within six months prior to the transfer, a sealed source received from another person shall not be put into use until tested.
- (2) Notwithstanding the periodic leak test required by this condition, any licensed sealed source is exempt from such leak tests when the source contains 100 microcuries or less of beta and/or gamma emitting material or 10 microcuries or less of alpha emitting material.
- B. The test shall be capable of detecting the presence of 0.005 microcurie of radioactive material on the test sample. The test sample shall be taken from the sealed source or from the surfaces of the device in which the sealed source is permanently mounted or stored on which one might expect contamination to accumulate. Records of leak test results shall be kept in units of microcuries and maintained for inspection by the Commission.
- C. If the test reveals the presence of 0.005 microcurie or more of removable contamination, the licensee shall immediately withdraw the sealed source from use and shall cause it to be decontaminated and repaired or to be disposed of in accordance with Commission regulations. A report shall be filed within five (5) days of the test with the U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III, 799 Roosevelt Road, Glen Ellyn, Illinois 60137, describing the equipment involved, the test results, and the corrective action taken.
- D. The licensee is authorized to collect leak test samples for analysis by the manufacturer. Alternatively, leak test samples may be collected and/or analyzed by other persons specifically authorized by the Commission or an Agreement State to perform such services.
14. Sealed sources containing licensed material shall not be opened or removed from their respective source holders by the licensee.
15. Installation, relocation, removal from service, maintenance, repair, and initial radiation survey of devices containing licensed material and installation, replacement, and disposal of sealed sources containing licensed material used in devices shall be performed only by the manufacturer or by other persons specifically authorized by the Commission or an Agreement State to perform such services.
16. The licensee shall operate each gauge within the manufacturer's specified temperature and environmental limits such that the shielding and shutter mechanism of the source holder is not compromised.

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17. Except as specifically provided otherwise by this license, the licensee shall possess and use licensed material described in Items 6, 7, and 8 of this license in accordance with statements, representations, and procedures contained in application dated December 21, 1979 and letter dated January 25, 1980. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's regulations shall govern the licensee's statements in applications or letters, unless the statements are more restrictive than the regulations.
