Gentlemen:

In the name of the Westinghouse Electric Corporation, I respectfully request that you amend the license for the use of byproduct materials #29-3892-1 (C64) as follows:

Condition 12. Byproduct material shall be used by, or under the direct supervision of Heinz G. Sell and Richard Corth.

Dr. Corth is being assigned to a new project which will make it difficult for him to supervise satisfactorily the use of byproduct materials by other members of the Research Department. It is of vital importance, however, that several of the research projects in progress be continued with little delay, in particular, the use of chemical tracers in diffusion studies, neutron activation analysis and autoradiographic investigations, all in tungsten.

I, Heinz G. Sell, the undersigned, consider myself qualified to assume full responsibility for the safe handling by myself and by others under my supervision, of byproduct materials in the licensed quantities and in compliance with the provisions of Title 10, Part 20, Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter I, "Standards for Protection against Radiation", which I have studied and I completely understand. In support of this request, I am enclosing a brief resume on my background and experience, specifically pertaining to the use of byproduct materials in research and development. I will be glad to furnish any additional information which you deem necessary for your decision in this case.
