This is in response to your "Notice of Violation" letter dated, October 8, 1992.

ITEM #1-
RESPONSE #1:

As a result of this incident, reprimands were issued and retraining in our I-131 procedure took place. In the future, whenever I-131 is compounded, a log with monitoring results will be kept. This will become effective November 16, 1992. I hope this solution is satisfactory.

ITEM #2-
RESPONSE #2:

In accordance with your confirmatory action letter dated, June 6, 1992, the gas dispensing machines will no longer be used. I have subsequently applied for, and received, a license amendment that allows me to use a syringe instead of the micropipette for compounding I-131 capsules. This will be the method of choice for our facility.

Our I-131 hood was decontaminated to below 2200dpm - CM2 prior to being reactivated. Also, our pharmacist's have all received a copy of the letter dated, November 8, 1992.
