
SUBJECT: Proposed Significant Hazards Finding for

To Whom It May Concern:

I am enclosing for filing New England Coalition on Nuclear Pollution's Comments In Opposition to Proposed Finding of No Significant Hazards Consideration. I am also enclosing a copy of NECNP's request for a hearing in this case.

NECNP's comments on the proposed no significant hazards consideration finding are supported by the affidavit of Robert D. Pollard, a nuclear safety engineer with the Union of Concerned Scientists.
