

Subject: Status of Regulatory Issues

Dear Mr. Vissing:

The purpose of this letter is to request a status up date on several issues which have had varying amounts of regulatory activity during the past two years. The B&W Owners Group Issue Management Program provides input to the B&W Owners Group which can be used in planning their future activities. With that in mind, it is requested that you provide information in the form of a brief status update on the following issues. Specifically it would be appreciated if we could obtain information about the staff's plans and any actions being considered which may involve B&W Owners Group action during the next six-twelve months. These issues are:

1. Inadequate Core Cooling Instrumentation
2. Reactor Coolant Pump Trip
3. Reactor Internals Bolting
4. Control Systems Interaction (excluding overfill considerations)
5. Pressurizer Safety Valve Operability
6. Integrated Safety Assessment Program
7. Adequacy of Safety Related DC Power Supplies
8. Seismic Qualification
9. Low Fracture Toughness of Component Supports

It would be appreciated if we could have a brief update on these items in time for our Steering Committee meeting during the last week of June.


