

PROGRAM CHANGES

The program changes shown in the above table are primarily to: obtain portions of the steam generators being replaced at Salem Unit 1 nuclear power plant to evaluate effects of materials aging; evaluate heat transfer properties of reactor fuel cladding as fuel rods age; evaluate indicators of potential plant performance; provide unique support for potential enforcement action; manage agency records storage in accordance with new records disposition requirements; and additional travel requirements.

³ This is the total of NRC's FY 1996 appropriations of \$473,300,000; minus the rescission of \$714,000; and the utilization of \$41,842,000 in funds unobligated at the end of FY 1995 and carried over into FY 1996.
