It is to also include, but not to be limited to, all instructions from the Commission to the staff, and correspondence between the staff and industry sources.

Specifically, this request is not to be limited to drafts of I&E Bulletin 80-11. It is to also include, but not to be limited to, all instructions from the Commission to the staff and correspondence between the staff and industry sources.



The Governor's Office of Consumer Services requests that you waive all copying and search fees pursuant to 5 U.S.C. Section 552 (a)(4)(A) "because furnishing the information can be considered as primarily benefitting the general public." The following facts support this request:

1. The Governor's Office of Consumer Services is a division of an executive agency of the State of Illinois, created pursuant to Executive Order 79-6.
2. The Governor's Office of Consumer Services is authorized to intervene on behalf of consumers of the State of Illinois in proceedings before the Illinois Commerce Commission.
3. These documents will assist the Governor's Office of Consumer Services in its intervention in a number of proceedings now pending before the Illinois Commerce Commission.
4. The size of the population potentially benefitted by these documents is approximately four million ratepayers of private electric utility companies in the State of Illinois which own nuclear power facilities in operation or under construction.
