Portions of documents 3, 4 and 5 on the enclosed appendix are being withheld pursuant to the FOIA exemptions cited on the appendix.


Information being withheld pursuant to Exemptions (6) and (7)(C) consists of names and telephone numbers, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. This information is being withheld from public disclosure pursuant to Exemptions (6) and (7)(C) of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. 552(b)(6) and (7)(C)) and 10 CFR 9.5(a)(6) and (7)(iii) of the NRC's regulations.

Pursuant to 10 CFR 9.15 of the NRC's regulations, it has been determined that the information withheld is exempt from production or disclosure and that its production or disclosure is contrary to the public interest. The person responsible for this denial is Mr. Ben B. Hayes, Director, Office of Investigations.

This denial may be appealed to the NRC within 30 days from the receipt of this letter. Any such appeal must be in writing, addressed to the Secretary of the Commission, U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, DC 20555, and should clearly state on the envelope and in the letter that it is an "Appeal from an Initial FOIA Decision."

The review of additional documents subject to your request has not been completed. As soon as the review is completed, we will advise you of our disclosure determination.

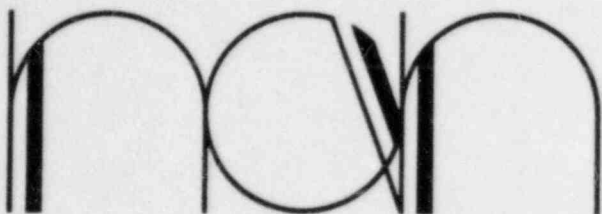

To whom it may concern:

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, U.S.C. 522, as amended, the Nuclear Awareness Network requests the following documents regarding the Wolf Creek Nuclear Power Plant. Please consider "documents" to include reports, studies, test results, correspondence, memoranda, meeting notes, meeting minutes, working papers, graphs, charts, diagrams, notes and summaries of conversations and interviews, computer records, and any other forms of written communication, including internal NRC Staff memoranda. The documents are specifically requested from, but not limited to, the following offices of the NRC: Office of the Analysis and Evaluation of Operational Data (AEOD); Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR); Office of Nuclear Regulatory Research (Research); Office of Inspection and Enforcement (I&E); Generic Issues Branch of the Division of Safety Technology, and the Operating Reactors Branches of the division of Licensing. In your response, please identify which documents correspond to which requests below.

Pursuant to this request, please provide all documents prepared or utilized by, in the possession of, or routed through the NRC related to:

1. Any and all Office of Investigation (OI) investigations, completed and ongoing.
2. Any and all OI Auditor reports concerning Wolf Creek or licensees.
3. Any and all "Systems Turnover", completed and ongoing.

If any of the material covered by this request has been destroyed and/or removed, please provide all surrounding documentation, including but not limited to a description of the action(s) taken, relevant date(s), and justification(s) for the actions.
