Dear Mr. Delaney:

We had a Source Material license #C-4327 allowing us to use depleted uranium oxide in the manufacture of ornamental glassware containing not more than 10% uranium. This license expired on October 31, 1961.

A letter has just been received from Mr. Jack Sutherland, Region #2, Division of Compliance, reminding us that our license had expired and even though we were not using any depleted uranium oxide, a license was now required to possess Source Material. We have not used any of this material since July of 1960 and we still have on hand the 328 pounds of depleted uranium oxide covered in our last license dated October 26, 1960.

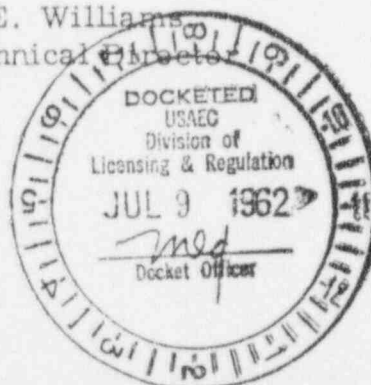
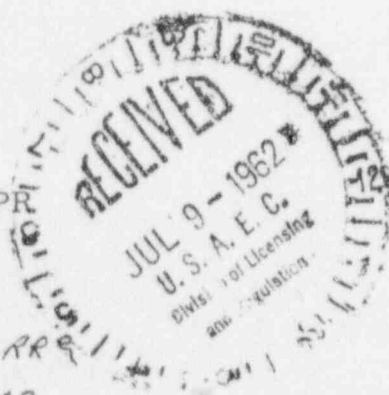
We do not foresee any immediate use for this material, but would appreciate having our license renewed so that we can comply with the requirements of the Atomic Energy Commission.
