Dear Mr. Delaney:

We have source material license #C-4327, Amendment 1, which expires October 21, 1960. This license permitted us to use uranium compounds in the manufacture of ornamental glassware containing not more than 10 per cent uranium.

At the present time, we have 328 lbs. of depleted uranium oxide on hand. In July of this year, we discontinued the line of glassware in which we were using the uranium; and consequently, have not used any uranium since this time. We do not have any immediate use for this material; but due to many colors that we are called on to make, it is probable that we will again produce some glass containing uranium. We foresee the following possibility at this time:

- (1) Experimental use of uranium in developing color in new glasses.
- (2) A special order for the uranium containing glass which has been discontinued.

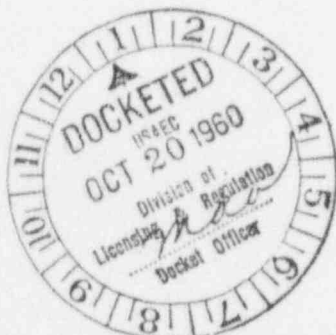
We would like to have our license extended for another year, covering the amount of material we have on hand. If it should develop during the year that production would exceed this amount, we would then apply for an Amendment to our license.
