Dear Mr. Delaney:

We have source material license #C-4327 permitting us to use 850 lbs. of Uranium in Uranium Compounds for use as a coloring agent in glass products. We now find that fall orders for this type of glass artware are exceeding our original estimates, and we would appreciate having this license increased from 850 lbs. to 1,105 lbs. or another 255 lbs. of Uranium.

Our present license expires October 31, 1959, and in order to continue production of this glass, it will be necessary for us by October to have a new license for the year 1959-1960. The use of Uranium will be the same as described in our application of September 26, 1958. However, because of the increased demand for this type of glass, we estimate that our requirements for the coming year will be 1,700 lbs. of Uranium in Uranium Compounds.

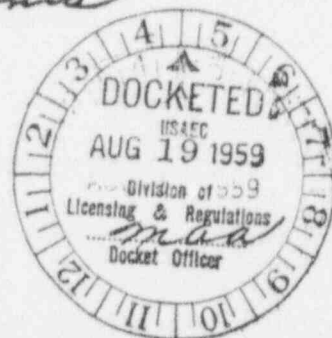
