Dear Mr. Brown:

The following is the information you requested in our telephone conversation on October 12, 1978, concerning our application for byproduct material license:

1. Method of Leak Testing:

Leak testing shall be performed at the required intervals using a Troxler RK-1 leak test kit. The leak test shall be performed by the Radiation Protection Officer who has been trained in the wiping procedure at a Troxler Nuclear Gauge Training Course. The filters will be analyzed by the Troxler Electronic Laboratories, Inc., in Sacramento, California.

2. Method of Disposal:

In the event that Indian Health Service discontinues the use of the Nuclear Gauge for any reason, it will be disposed of by shipping it to a legally authorized disposal service, licensed by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission or a member state.
