
Dear Mr. LaFranzo:

This is in response to your request for clarification of Standard Nuclear Consultants' emergency response telephone number in place while radioactive materials are in transport by Standard Nuclear Consultants personnel. This request was made in follow up to the June 27, 1996 inspection of Standard Nuclear Consultants. You indicated the concern was that if the consultant carrying the emergency pager were rendered unconscious in an accident, he would be unable to respond to the emergency by telephone.

To ensure that emergency telephone access is always available while radioactive materials are in transport, the shipping papers carried by each consultant will contain the emergency pager number of the other consultant. Because the two consultants do not transport materials in the same vehicle at the same time, this would always give emergency telephone coverage.


