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Result of examination:

Six enhanced monaural copies each of specimens Q1 and Q2 were made, with each copy on separate sets of magnetic tape cassettes.

Two enhanced monaural copies each of specimens Q3 through Q16 were made, with each copy on separate sets of magnetic tape cassettes.

In order to obtain maximum intelligibility, the enhanced copies should be played back on high-quality tape recorders and reviewed with headphones.

In consultation with Mr. Larry L. Robinson and Mr. William D. Hutchison of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission on October 8, 1991, it was decided that no extensive authenticity examination should be conducted on specimens Q1 through Q16 at this time.

Supervisory Special Agent James John Ryan, Jr. conducted the enhancement examination.

Specimens Q1 through Q16 and the enhanced copies were forwarded to your office via Federal Express in two shipments on October 16, 1991 and October 24, 1991 respectively.
