As intervenors, R.L. Anthony/Friends of the Earth in the Delaware Valley, are in receipt of a memorandum from you to Edward L. Jordan, NRC, dated 5/21/85, forwarded to us as a copy of a communication to the NRC Licensing Board Judges from D.F. Hassell, 5/28/85.

Since our contentions before the Licensing Board are concerned with the safety of the public in the Valley Forge Park/King of Prussia area in the event of a radiological emergency at the Limerick plant we are concerned with any traffic control or other plans for that area.

On page 2 of your memorandum you refer to a 5/10/85 memorandum requesting FEMA assistance re. conditions set by the Licensing Board in its 5/7/85 initial decision, "to implement level of control in the King of Prussia area." We are not aware of ever being provided with a copy of this memorandum, in conformity with the Board's long standing order that all material be served on all the parties, related to their contentions. Will you kindly provide this copy for us.

On page 3 you refer to a telephone conversation with FEMA with the information that "a plan of action to address the traffic control issue" had been developed and forwarded to the Pennsylvania State Police. We, also, are not aware that any copy of this plan has been sent to us. We have no knowledge of it up to now. We believe this is a violation of the Board's order on the providing of documents to the parties. We request that you provide us with a copy of this plan without any further delay since the information is essential to us in pursuing our appeal rights.

We are puzzled as to how you can conclude "emergency planning and preparedness is now adequate... in the event of a radiological emergency at the Limerick Generating Station" (page 2) while the Board's condition on traffic control in the King of Prussia area has not been reviewed, nor is there any assurance it can be implemented or successfully tested. We ask you to reconsider your conclusion on the Limerick offsite emergency plans and withdraw your statement that the plans are "now adequate" and "can be implemented."

We trust that you will do us the favor of making an early response.
