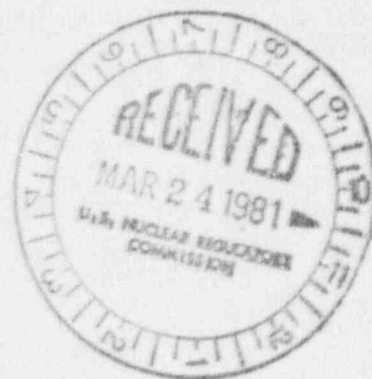

Gentlemen:

As discussed in the telephone conversation of Mr. R. J. Gregg with Mr. W. T. Crow on January 26, 1981, and noted in your letter of the same date, the activities now being conducted by UNC Recovery Systems are not of the type for which an emergency plan is required. Accordingly, pursuant to Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 70, Special Nuclear Material License No. SNM-777 is hereby amended to delete Condition No. 12.

All other conditions of this license shall remain the same.

As discussed by R. Stevenson with Mr. R. Gregg on March 9, 1981, it is our understanding that you will continue to maintain emergency equipment and arrangements with local hospitals, ambulance service, and fire departments to provide for possible fires or contaminated injuries.
