Enclosed is Amendment No. 57 to your U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Materials License No. 21-16732-01 in accordance with your February 7, 2020 request to remove the Brachytherapy Radioactive Material Storage Room in the Radiation Therapy department area of use from the Petoskey, Michigan location of use and to add an updated facility diagram for an the hot lab in the Nuclear Medicine department area of use at that same location of use. This letter also concerns your February 19, 2020 request to remove the Cheboygan, Michigan location of use from your license. Your initial letters and an additional information letter dated May 1, 2020, are available electronically from the NRC Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) at Accession Nos. ML20043E253, ML20059N103, and ML20129J987, respectively. The NRC's ADAMS is accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html>.

Please review the enclosed document carefully, and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. NRC Region III Office at 630-828-9887, so that we may provide appropriate corrections and answers.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required, since this action is categorically excluded under Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) Section 51.22(c).

The NRC staff has reviewed your final status survey for your Brachytherapy Radioactive Material Storage Room in the Radiation Therapy department area of use at the Petoskey, Michigan, location of use. The NRC staff has also reviewed your final status survey for your Cheboygan, Michigan, location of use. Based on its review, the NRC staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from the referenced area of use and location of use, incorporated by reference on NRC License No. 21-16732-01, and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria.

The enclosures to this letter contain sensitive security-related information.  
When separated from this cover letter this letter is uncontrolled.

Based on these conclusions, no further remediation or actions are required with respect to NRC-regulated material, for the Brachytherapy Radioactive Material Storage Room in the Radiation Therapy department area of use at the 416 Connable Ave., Petoskey, MI 49770 location of use. The referenced area is suitable for unrestricted use.

In addition, based on these conclusions, no further remediation or actions are required with respect to NRC-regulated material, for the location of use at 748 S Main St., Cheboygan, MI 49721. That referenced location is suitable for unrestricted use. Your NRC Materials License No. 21-16732-01 has been amended accordingly.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
