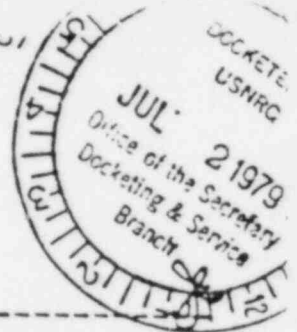

JOHN F. DOHERTY'S FIRST SET OF INTEROGATORIES TO THE STATE OF TEXAS

John F. Doherty, Intervenor in the above proceedings files the above Interogatories pursuant to 10 CFR 2.740b. Items 1 and 2 may be answered "yes" or "no". Items 3 and 4 should be answered fully. All words are to be given common meaning. The word "program" means: program of study, course offering, department of study, seminars, or workshops.

1- Is the State of Texas aware of any discussion between any official of the University of Houston (UH) and Houston Lighting & Power (HLP) with regards to:

- (a) Constructing any new building on any UH campus
- (b) Paying for any part of the construction of any building on any UH campus
- (c) Establishing a joint program where students from UH would work for HLP or its parent corporation Houston Industries.
- (d) Establishing a joint program where students would be taught nuclear power for utilities, including but not limited to: 1) reactor principals, 2) reactor operation, 3) radiation metallurgy.
- (e) The giving of any money or loaning of any money to UH for any: 1) curricula, 2) scientific equipment, 3) research reactors, 4) cyclotrons or like devices, 5) faculty salaries or salary supplements, 6) endowed academic chairs for any academic department, 7) any other financial contributions or loans?

2- Is the State aware of any contribution of money (other than taxes) by HLP to any of the items and subparts of item #1 above?


3- If the answer to any part or subpart of the two items above is "yes", please indicate the following:

- a) The number and/or letter of the item or subpart
- b) The particular building, program, equipment, academic department, academic chair, courses, discussed or already provided in whole or in part
- c) The location of any building, program, equipment, academic department, academic chair, course, or programs discussed or already provided in whole or in part. (Note: an answer such as: "UH Clear Lake campus" is sufficient)

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- d) The amount of money discussed or provided by UH.
 - e) (For item 1) the name and position of the official of UH who discussed with HLP.
 - f) (For item 2) please attempt to locate the name of the official from UH or officials involved in the event.
 - g) The dates of anything described in item 1 and item 2.
4. Is the state of Texas aware of any research grants funded by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) at the University of Houston or any of its campus'? If so, please identify them and the amount granted for the current fiscal year.
