Attached you will find information and completed forms concerning our application for renewal of License No. 26-16293-01, Veterans Administration Medical Center, 600 South 70th Street, Lincoln, Nebraska 68510.

Since some of the questions you posed in your letter of December 11, 1980 do not correspond to specific topics on the NRC-313M forms, we have taken the liberty of including a copy of that letter and attachments referenced to the paragraph numbers it contains. In this way we hope we can facilitate your ongoing review and provide the answers you require for approving licensure.

Please note, however, that in paragraph 6a, page 1 of the application, we have omitted several factors included in our previous application. These refer to Iodine-131 for therapy procedures. Dr. Zeman informs us that, although we wish to continue the use of I-131 in some diagnostic procedures, we do not perform enough thyroid treatment to continue requesting licensure on the previous basis (I refer to "Additional Items"--Iodine-131 as iodide for treatment of hyperthyroidism, and Iodine-131 as iodide for treatment of thyroid carcinoma).
