Date: April 1, 1981

Transportation: During transport, be it from the Wethersfield, Connecticut Office to a job site or between job sites, the Device shall only be placed in the rear of a survey van or in the trunk of a passenger vehicle. Under no circumstance will the Device be transported in the back of an open bed vehicle.

Prevention of Unauthorized Use: During use at a job site, the Device will never be left unattended. At least one individual will be close enough to the Device to prevent tampering or unauthorized removal.

Prevention of Unauthorized Removal: The permanent location for the Device is 161 Main Street, Wethersfield, Connecticut. The temporary location for the Device is the project trailer, 528 Grand Avenue, New Haven, Connecticut. At all times other than in transport or in use, the Device will be stored under lock within the structure at either of the above locations.

Emergency Procedures: In case of accident involving damage or loss of the Device, one of the following individuals must be notified immediately:

Maintenance on Devices: No employee will attempt to maintain, in any way, the Device. Any maintenance involving removal of source holder shall be performed by the manufacturer. All such requests for maintenance shall be made to one of the individuals noted above.
