
Dear Mr. Kammerer:

I am writing to request an update of the Commission's activities in the area of plant worker safety, particularly in efforts underway or contemplated to find ways to reduce the radiation exposure levels encountered on a daily basis by nuclear power plant workers.

I have heard concerns expressed by nuclear power plant workers in my District who are hopeful technologies can be introduced that will result in reduced levels of daily radiation exposure. I share the workers' hope that the federal government can work in conjunction with industry and labor to devise systems and practices that reduce to the maximum extent possible radiation exposure in nuclear power plants.
