
Dear Friends:

Honorable Senator Sarbanes,

May 16, 1984

I request that you use your efforts to get  
Three Mile Island Unit Number One (TMI-1) nuclear  
facility restarted. All changes required of the  
facility have been made to the point that  
the TMI-1 generating unit equals or exceeds  
the standards set forth for this industry. Also, the  
senior staff and operators of the facility have  
been thoroughly trained to meet the criteria  
established for the industry. Since the nuclear  
generation of power is a legal activity, <sup>environmentally</sup>  
the cleanest known to man and cheapest method  
of generating power, I urge you to support restarting  
TMI-1.
