
Dear Mr. Palladino:

I am writing as a member of the nuclear power industry to urge your support in an early decision by the Commissioners of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission on the restart of Three Mile Island, Unit 1.

We believe the NRC now has an adequate basis on which to decide the lifting of its 1979 Shutdown Orders of TMI-1. This early decision will ease a major burden of uncertainty from both the industry and the regional economy affected by the order.
