

NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Environmental Control Technology, INC.
Ann Arbor, Michigan

During an NRC inspection conducted on October 21, 1996, violations of NRC requirements were identified. In accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions," NUREG-1600, the violations are listed below:

1. Condition 16. of License No. 21-15470-02 Amendment No. 02, requires that the licensee conduct a physical inventory every six (6) months to account for all foil sources received and possessed under the license.

Contrary to the above, the licensee has not conducted an inventory every six months to account for all foil sources received and possessed under the license. Specifically, the licensee failed to conduct a physical inventory from the date of issuance of the license until January 17, 1994, and from January 17, 1994, to the date of inspection, October 21, 1996.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

2. Condition 17.A. of License No. 21-15470-02 Amendment No. 02 requires that sealed sources and detector cells shall be tested for leakage and/or contamination at intervals not to exceed intervals as specified by the certificate of registration referred to in 10 CFR 32.210.

Contrary to the above, the licensee failed to provide leak tests on five of the cells in its possession within the 36 month interval specified by the certificate of registration for the cells in its possession. Specifically, cells A5282, A5361, A6183, C-8192, and A8822 were not leak tested within the 36 month interval specified by the certificate of registration provided by the cell vendor.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

3. 10 CFR 30.34(b) requires that no license issued or granted pursuant to the regulations in this part and parts 31 through 36, and 39, nor any right under a license shall be transferred, assigned, or in any manner disposed of either voluntarily or involuntarily, directly or indirectly, through transfer of control of any license to any person, unless the Commission shall, after securing full information, find that the transfer is in accordance with the provisions of the Act and shall give its consent in writing.

Contrary to the above, on August 5, 1986, Environmental Control Technology, Incorporated transferred license number 21-15470-02 to Rollins Environmental, Incorporated without obtaining the consent of the Commission in writing.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, Environmental Control Technology is hereby required to submit a written statement or explanation to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, D.C. 20555, with a copy to the Regional Administrator, Region III, 801 Warrenville Road, Lisle, Illinois 60532-4351 within 30 days of the date of the letter transmitting this Notice of Violation (Notice). This reply should be clearly marked as a "Reply to a Notice of Violation" and should include for each violation: (1) the reason for the violation, or, if contested, the basis for disputing the violation, (2) the corrective steps that have been taken and the results achieved, (3) the corrective steps that will be taken to avoid further violations, and (4) the date when full compliance will be achieved. Your response may reference or include previous docketed correspondence, if the correspondence adequately addresses the required response. If an adequate reply is not received within the time specified in this Notice, an order or a Demand for Information may be issued as to why the license should not be modified, suspended, or revoked, or why such other action as may be proper should not be taken. Where good cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending the response time.

Because your response will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room (PDR), to the extent possible, it should not include any personal privacy, proprietary, or safeguards information so that it can be placed in the PDR without redaction. However, if you find it necessary to include such information, you should clearly indicate the specific information that you desire not to be placed in the PDR, and provide the legal basis to support your request for withholding the information from the public.
