July 12

Mr. Masefield

Talked with patient and he's feeling better.

Patient told Masefield it was his understanding that starting this evening his transfusions would be cut in half.

Dr. Niel Wald

Patient about the same as yesterday. This morning, however, really hungry.

Spiking a fever (going up and falling again).

Intravenous administration of antibiotics and platelets being given.

He probably will receive a transfusion of white cells today.

July 13

Mr. Masefield

No change in patient - same as Friday.

Talked with doctors this morning and with patient last night.

Patient didn't feel too good over weekend.

Dr. Niel Wald

Talked with doctors late yesterday. Patient still in a critical period.

Antibiotics being administered.

White cell transfusion administered Saturday.

Platelets going down - white cells virtually non-existent.

Still spiking a fever.

There's a hint of recovery in that white cell count a little higher:

No localized infection but fighting a fever.
