RE: Comments on Proposed Rules, Fed. Reg. 7 June 1985

Gentlemen:

I have a small consulting engineering practice and a license to operate a nuclear densometer as a service to my clients to provide quality assurance on their construction projects. I offer the following comments on the proposed rules:

1. As a small businessman, I can not afford to purchase additional insurance (if available) without raising the charges to my clients.
2. Nuclear densometers pose no threat to public safety and should therefore be exempted from the proposed rules.
3. As a taxpayer, I can see no justification for increasing the size of the NRC bureaucracy to protect the public from a non-problem. Your administrative costs for enforcement of the proposed rules will exceed the cost of an occasional government funded cleanup of accidental low-level source releases.
