

Dear Mr. Hunter:

The purpose of this letter is to provide an update on PSC's efforts to qualify Fort St. Vrain's (FSV) Post Accident Monitoring (PAM) equipment as identified in Reference 1.

By letter dated March 28, 1985 (Reference 2) PSC committed to a date of September 30, 1985 as the date by which all documentation of the qualification of FSV's Regulatory Guide 1.97 Category I and II equipment would be in place in our Environmental Qualification (EQ) files.

However, our EQ files are being totally reformatted, as described in Reference 3. Therefore, PSC will be unable to have the qualification documentation for the FSV PAM equipment in our files by September 30, 1985. The auditable EQ files for this equipment will be implemented on the same schedule as the files for the FSV equipment required for forced circulation cooling.

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PSC intends to continue to qualify the equipment identified in Reference 1 pending a response from NRC on the acceptability of the FSV PAM parameters and equipment.
