Dear Mr. Glenn;

With regard to your letter of 26 June 1985 requesting additional information to support my application for material license dated 8 Feb. 1985 I would like to request an extension of sixty (60) days.

I am principal of a start-up business venture which is involved in the export of products for the biotechnology and medical diagnostics markets. At this moment I am negotiating with suppliers for their representation and have not yet finalized or determined the necessity for the license in question. You can see that without such agreement completion of the licensing process would be of no value.

It appears that the additional information which your commission requires will burden my company to an extent which I would have preferred to avoid. Please understand that the company will perform no activities with any radioactive package that will differ from those activities routinely performed by any freight forwarding company in the United States. These companies are not required to have license and training, usually familiarization at best, is often provided by manufacturers to allay the fears of the freight carriers employees. In reviewing NRC guidelines I felt that license was necessary to my operations simply to provide me a license number which would allow the company to take title to goods which are destined for overseas markets.

If I were to arrange for goods to be consigned to foreign destinations being exported under general licenses granted to the manufacturers with payment for goods to be provided by my company would this negate the need for license? In this scenario my company would be no different than a freight forwarder other than that we will be responsible for payment of the goods. Please understand that it is not my intention to circumvent NRC or Commerce Dept regulations, but I do not want to be unnecessarily burdened with the economic and compliance requirements.

Knowing that this letter will receive careful and thoughtful review please also consider the national need to increase exports, an activity to which my company is totally dedicated.


