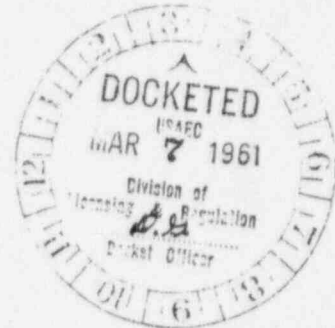

Gentlemen:

We wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated February 24 addressed to Nuclear Corporation of America, Isotopes Specialties Company Division.

You have already been informed that the Isotopes Specialties Company Division has been sold to U. S. Nuclear Corporation. However, Nuclear Corporation of America is pleased to inform you that the 25 drums of radioactive waste which had radiation levels at the surface exceeding 200 mr/hr referred to in your letters of December 12 and 22, 1960 have been disposed of by transfer to the National Reactor Testing Station, Idaho Falls, Idaho, for land burial.

Nuclear Corporation of America verifies this transfer and further verifies that all waste byproduct, source and special nuclear material waste received under License No. 4-580-6 has been disposed of and is no longer in storage at 170 W. Providence, Burbank, California.
