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Dear Mr. Hukill:

The staff and its consultant, EG&G, Idaho, have completed the review of your responses to Items 3.1.3 and 3.2.3 of Generic Letter 83-28, Required Actions Based on Generic Implication of Salem ATWS Event, dated July 3, 1983.

Item 3.1.3 (Post-Maintenance Testing of Reactor Trip System (RTS) Components) requires that licensees and applicants identify, if applicable, any post-maintenance test requirements for the RTS in existing technical specifications which can be demonstrated to degrade rather than enhance safety. Item 3.2.3 extends this same requirement to include all other safety-related components. Any proposed technical specification changes resulting from this action shall receive a pre-implementation review by NRC.

You responded to our concerns by letter dated November 8, 1983. In your letter you stated that, to date, you have not identified post-maintenance test requirements in existing technical specifications which could be demonstrated to degrade rather than enhance safety. Accordingly, we conclude that your responses to Items 3.1.3 and 3.2.3 are acceptable and these issues are resolved.
