COMMISSION FACING CONGRESSIONAL OPPOSITION TO MOVING OI INTO STAFF

Chairman Nunzio Palladino is proposing to move the commission level Office of Investigations (OI) under the authority of the executive director for operations. His idea has a tentative commission majority and opposition from Capitol Hill.

OI was formed in 1982 after criticisms were leveled by Justice Department officials, NRC's Office of Inspector & Auditor (OIA), and congressional critics of investigations conducted by the Office of Inspection & Enforcement (IE), including some Three Mile Island-2 investigations (INRC, 27 Dec. '82, 1). There have been proposals for a statutory, independent agency inspector-general, but those have not won commission support. After months of internal debate, the commission decided to make OI a commission-level agency, reporting to commissioners rather than to staff head William Dircks.

However, OI has been attacked by industry as a needless source of delay in plant licensing. Rep. Tom Bevill (D-Ala.), chairman of the Appropriations Committee subcommittee overseeing NRC, has for several years criticized the number of offices reporting to the commission as unwieldy, but, in a March 14, 1984 letter to Bevill, the commission defended its decision to add OI by citing a need to separate technical and criminal investigative functions.

Palladino's proposal came in a budget memo proposing other adjustments to handle the \$429-million budget allotted NRC by the Office of Management & Budget (see related story), and did not specify whether OI would remain a separate office or become a division of IE, as has been proposed by some top staffers. Tentatively favoring the idea, according to commission sources, are Commissioners Thomas Roberts and Lando Zech. Roberts has questioned whether some investigations undertaken by OI are related to nuclear safety, and has said management control is needed. One source said there is also unhappiness among some early OI supporters at what is perceived as OI's failure to make tough findings in investigations in which both licensees and NRC might be at fault.

Commissioners were scheduled to discuss moving OI in a closed session on internal management matters last week, but they have already been told that, if Bevill likes the idea, other important congressmen don't. Rep. Morris Udall (D-Ariz.), chairman of the Interior & Insular Affairs Committee that oversees NRC authorizations, has written, "Placing OI under the EDO would, it seems to me, place EDO managers in a situation where they would be called upon to make judgments on matters in which they had a pre-existing interest. The change would, therefore, compromise OI's independence which I believe is crucial if OI is to do its job." The man expected to chair NRC's other authorizing subcommittee, Rep. Edward Markey (D-Mass.), has not been commenting on NRC matters until he is confirmed by the House Democratic caucus. However, Markey was a vocal critic of NRC investigations before OI's formation (INRC, 27 June '83, 12).—Margaret L. Ryan, Washington

RESEARCH CONTINUES TO BEAR BRUNT OF CUTS AS OMB RESTORES \$80-MILLION

The Office of Management & Budget (OMB) has reversed its dramatic cuts to NRC's fiscal year 1986 budget (INRC, 24 Dec. '84, 1), following agency and industry complaints that such a budget would not only prevent NRC from carrying out its legal duties but would also harm the nuclear industry (Nucleonics Week, 3 Jan., 6). The new recommendation raises agency funding to \$429-million, from an earlier figure of \$350-million and retains NRC's current staffing level. The recommendation is still \$19-million below FY-85 estimated funding levels and more than \$100-million below the agency's request, but complaints about that loss are muted.

However, because half of the current fiscal year's pay raise and all of any FY-86 pay raise must

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
