SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF MEETING HELD ON AUGUST 1, 1985, TO DISCUSS

THE CP&L INTEGRATED SCHEDULING PLAN AND LICENSE AMENDMENT

Background

The following events have occurred since the February 28, 1985 meeting with CP&L in the same subject:

1. On April 29, 1985 CP&L submitted a proposed amendment to the licensing which would incorporate a condition requiring the use of the Integrated Plant Modification Plan (The Plan).
2. On June 27, 1985 CP&L submitted a draft schedule for information and requested a meeting in mid-to-late July to discuss the details of the schedule
3. On July 9, 1985 CP&L requested an extension from November 30, 1985 to March 30, 1986 to complete Environmental Qualification (EQ) for Unit 2.

The August 1, 1985 meeting was held to discuss the above events and related items. The attendees are listed in Attachment 1.

Meeting Summary

The meeting was opened by Marshall Grotenhuis who stated that there were three issues effecting the draft schedules which were not readily resolvable. These are, the CP&L request for an extension of time to complete the environmental qualification of Unit 2, the NRC staff review of the shutdown capability assessment, (ASCA) dated April 24, 1984, as supplemented December 21, 1985 alternates and the revision of the dates proposed in the CP&L December 27, 1984 submittal regarding NUREG-0737 supplement 1.

The CP&L presentation discussed the draft schedule and how the three issues would effect it. The effect on the schedule of a denial of the EQ extension request would move the Unit 2 schedule for reload from March 30, 1986 to November 30, 1985. The next reloads and the reload related items would shift in a similar manner, that is the entire schedule would shift by 120 days without changing the length of the outage nor the work scheduled to be completed in that outage.

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
The ASCA review by the staff would also likely effect the schedule and, since it is outage related work, would shift by outage. However, the effect of any changes due to the completion of this review would have to be assessed after the review is completed and the staff safety evaluation is issued.

Similarly, the schedule for completion of emergency response facility (ERF) items as outlined in NUREG-0737 supplement, would depend in the staff review of the proposed completion date. CP&L proposed such dates in the December 27, 1984 submittal, however, those dates are under revision and the final dates will be submitted with the final integrated schedule

In addition CP&L presented information regarding the efforts being expended as a basis for a showing of good faith attempts to complete the regulatory requirements in the Integrated Schedule.

Conclusion

CP&L will submit a final schedule, which in view of the above discussed uncertainties, will of necessity have items which may change. These items will be designated by footnotes which will indicate the possible changes. The staff will review the submitted schedule and determine when or if the amendment proposed on April 29, 1985 can be issued.
