

Discussion: The licensee reported finding a burned pickup truck on their property early Monday morning. An unidentified person (or persons) apparently drove the truck through the licensee's chained gate during the weekend, and left many skid marks on the parking lot, before setting the truck on fire. The truck was located near a large warehouse building, and was not visible to the local residences. The fire was not reported to the local fire dept. The licensee indicated that there was no damage to the building. The licensee reported the incident to the police department, which responded Monday morning. The police indicated that the truck was stolen. The truck was subsequently towed away later in the day. Also, the licensee has repaired the gate. The licensee does not believe that the incident was a threat against the facility.
