This refers to your letter dated June 20, 1985, in response to our letter dated May 24, 1985.

In response to Item B, an evaluation has been made of the dose to the extremities of Helen Briggs, who lost her ring dosimeter in five of the twelve months of 1984. These results have been included in her permanent exposure record.

In response to Item C, radioactive waste will be segregated according to radionuclide into plastic trash cans lined with two plastic bags. Full bags will be tied and labeled with the radionuclide, date, and technologist's initials and stored in the hot trash room for a minimum of ten half-lives. Bags will be monitored prior to disposal, after ten half-lives has been reached, to insure that radiation levels cannot be distinguished from background.

In response to Item D, dose calibratory checks will be monitored daily by the Chief Technologist or designated Acting Assistant Chief Technologist and multiple daily spot checks will be made by the Chief Technologist or designated Acting Assistant Chief Technologist to insure that all technologists are properly wearing their ring dosimeters.
