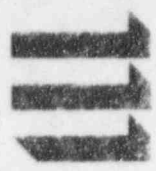

The licensee is authorized to export 500,000.0 kilograms natural uranium in the form of uranium ore concentrates (U_3O_8).

This license is amended to: 1) extend the expiration date from 31 December 1995 to 31 December 1999; and, 2) change the Ultimate Consignee Country to Canada.

The shipment of Australian and Canadian origin material is authorized.

Retransfer of the material from Canada to the EURATOM Community will require separate prior approval by the U.S. Government.

All other Conditions remain unchanged.
