Dear Mr. Sreniawski:

I received your notice of violation with your date of July 29, 1985.  
To address the matter of corrective action, I offer the following:

1. CORRECTIVE ACTION AND RESULTS ACHIEVED

At the time of Mr. W. P. Reichhold's inspection of July 2, 1985 we became aware of the need to change the documents pursuant to the provisions of the 10 CFR 2.201. Mr. Robert Dean Russell left our employment in August of 1982. At the next training session that was available, Mr. Todd Romkema received training (May, 1983). At that time he was qualified for licensing. We have now sent all applicable certification and funds for Mr. Romkema and they were received in your office on July 22, 1985 and assigned your Control No. 79446. We are awaiting your action.

2. CORRECTIVE ACTION TO BE TAKEN TO AVOID FURTHER NON-COMPLIANCE

We will in the future immediately make changes appropriate to change the license to maintain compliance.

3. DATE WHEN FULL COMPLIANCE WILL BE ACHIEVED

This was achieved on August 14, 1985 when our license was amended by B. J. Holt of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. See attached.

I do have a question on the subject of your notice of violation. In the third paragraph, second sentence you state, "Specifically, Mr. Russell left the company in August 1982, and licensed material was used



by and under the supervision of an individual not authorized by the license." This was not the case since the subject material never was used. I question whether the "and" at this point in the sentence should not be an "or". While the material was not used, it most definitely was not under the supervision.

I hope this response is satisfactory and am looking forward to your office approving the change in License Condition 12.
