Dear Sir:

In accordance with 10 C.F.R. §30.38, Well Logging, Inc. hereby requests that its NRC Byproduct Material License No. 35-18229-01 be amended as follows:

Condition 10. One of the trucks and associated equipment currently being stored in Well Logging's Nowata, Oklahoma facility will in the future be stored at 515 W. Cherry, Cushing, Oklahoma, 74023. A drawing of the new facility is attached. The building is constructed of steel and access to the storage area is by means of three locked steel overhead doors and one locked steel walk-in door. The telephone number for the facility is (918)225-1456.

Condition 12. Add Steven R. Moody as an operator, responsible for using or supervising the use of the licensed material. Mr. Moody was a well logging operator for Gearhart Industries in Coffeyville, Kansas from December, 1980 to February, 1982. In that position he worked with licensed source material identical to that used by Well Logging. Mr. Moody has completed the training course for radiation safety for oil well logging conducted by Gulf Nuclear, Inc. He is fully aware of the procedures used by Well Logging as contained in the Well Logging Operating Instructions and Emergency Procedures Manual.


