

SUBJ: Request for License Amendment


1. Item 6.G. of our present license (extended under timely renewal) authorizes us to possess 25 millicuries of each radionuclide with Atomic Nos. 3 through 83, inclusive. However, since August 2, 1983, our authorized use, item 9.C., has been restricted to "research studies in humans as approved by a Radioactive Drug Research Committee that has been approved by the Food and Drug Administration. We request an extension of our authorization for item 9.C. to include "research and development as defined in Section 30.4(q), 10 CFR Part 30."

2. We will need to maintain our specific authorizations for all items, except L. through P. If we are granted the request in paragraph 1 above, then items L. through P will no longer be necessary.

3. We also request that you increase the our authorized inventory of hydrogen 3 in item 8.H from 250 to 300 millicuries.
